

**CITY OF TEMPLE CITY
CITY COUNCIL MEETING ACTIONS**

These are some of the City Council actions from their meetings of August 20, 2019. This is an unofficial record of the City Council meeting. The Minutes, once approved by the City Council at a subsequent meeting, become the official record of the meeting.

At the special meeting of August 20, 2019, the City Council:

- Met in Closed Session regarding “Pending Litigation”. There is no reportable action;
- Met in Closed Session regarding “Anticipated Litigation”. There is no reportable action;
- Met in Closed Session regarding “Conference with Labor Negotiator”. There is no reportable action; and
- Met in Closed Session regarding “Pending Litigation”. There is no reportable action.

At the regular meeting of August 20, 2019, the City Council:

- Received a presentation on Eaton Wash Bike Path Design from Los Angeles County Public Works;
- Confirmed appointment of Youth Committee members;
- Approved Minutes of the Special City Council Meeting of August 6, 2019;
- Approved Minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of August 6, 2019;
- Reviewed and approved the final subdivision map for Parcel Map No. 81341 and authorized the City Clerk to certify Parcel map No. 81341;
- Authorized the City Manager to execute a three-year professional services agreement with Axiom Designs & Printing to print and coordinate the mailing of CONNECT and RecCONNECT at a cost not to exceed \$161,055;
- Received and filed the Petty Cash Report;
- Adopted Resolution No. 19-5420 authorizing the payment of bills for Fiscal Year 2018-19;
- Adopted Resolution No. 19-5421 authorizing the payment of bills for Fiscal Year 2019-20;
- Continued the public hearing for Ordinance No. 19-1036 amending Title 9, Chapter 1 of the Temple City Municipal Code adopting the Temple City Zoning Map, repealing the Downtown Specific Plan, and adopting an addendum to the Temple City Mid-Century General Plan Update and Crossroads Specific Plan Environmental Impact Report;
- Continued the discussion on the Memorandum of Agreement with the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments for participation in the regional Coyote Management Implementation Plan;
- Concurred that members of the Council, at their own expense, can visit Hualien County at any time;
- Received updates from the City Manager and City Attorney; and
- Received Councilmember reports on items separate from the meeting agenda.
