

**CITY OF TEMPLE CITY  
CITY COUNCIL MEETING ACTIONS**

These are some of the City Council actions from their meeting of May 17, 2022. This is an unofficial record of the City Council meetings. The Minutes, once approved by the City Council at a subsequent meeting, become the official record of the meetings.

At the Special meeting of May 17, 2022, the City Council:

- Met in Closed Session for a Conference with Labor Negotiator. There is no reportable action; and
- Met in Closed Session for Conference with Legal Counsel for three items of anticipated litigation. There is no reportable action.

At the Regular meeting of May 17, 2022, the City Council:

- Approved the Minutes of the Regular City Council Meeting of May 3, 2022;
- Approved the Minutes of the Special City Council Meeting of May 10, 2022;
- Adopted Resolution No. 22-5591 confirming Mayor's appointment of Councilmembers to serve as delegates and alternates to other agencies or organizations;
- Adopted Ordinance No. 22-1060 Series B Code Amendments of Title 9 (Zoning Regulations), Chapter 1 (Zoning Code);
- Adopted Ordinance No. 22-1061 amending Title 4 ("Law Enforcement"), Chapter 2 ("Nuisances") of the Temple City Municipal Code to provide for regulations pertaining to the maintenance and landscaping of vacant properties;
- Reviewed and approved the First Amendment to the Service Agreement with Gretchen Sterling to operate and manage the Temple City Certified Farmers Market;
- Awarded a Professional Services Agreement to Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. to prepare the Local Road Safety Plan and authorized the City Manager to execute the Contract in an amount of \$40,247.39;
- Received and filed the Visa Card Report;
- Adopted Resolution No. 22-5596 approving payment of bills for Fiscal Year 2021-22;
- Established an ad hoc committee for the development of city property located at 9050 Las Tunas Drive, and resolved the Las Tunas Downtown Revitalization Committee and Future Development of City Property Standing Committee. Directed staff to evaluate the need to establish an ad hoc committee to review the city's code and policy relating to property maintenance and bring back refined parameter for this committee for Council consideration at a future meeting;
- Received updates from the City Attorney and City Manager; and
- Received Councilmember reports on items separate from the meeting agenda.
