

**CITY OF TEMPLE CITY
CITY COUNCIL MEETING ACTIONS**

These are some of the City Council actions from their meeting of February 7, 2023. This is an unofficial record of the City Council meeting. The Minutes, once approved by the City Council at a subsequent meeting, become the official record of the meeting.

At the Special meeting of February 7, 2023, the City Council:

- Met in Closed Session regarding “Potential Litigation”. There is no reportable action; and
- Met in Closed Session regarding “Labor Negotiation”. There is no reportable action.

At the Regular meeting of February 7, 2023, the City Council:

- Approved the City Council Special Meeting Minutes of January 10, 17, and 25, 2023 and Regular Meeting Minutes of January 17, 2023 and found that the City Council Minutes is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Received and filed the Planning Commission Actions of December 13, 2022 and found that the Commission Actions is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Adopted Resolution No. 23-5654 authorizing the use of teleconferencing or videoconferencing for Brown Act-covered public meetings of the City Council and City commissions until February 28, 2023 and found that adoption of Resolution 23-5654 is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guideline 15061(b)(3);
- Affirmed City Council reorganization on March 7, 2023 and found that affirming Council reorganization date is not a “Project” as defined under Section 15378 of the California Environmental Quality Act State Guidelines; therefore, pursuant to State Guidelines Section 15060(c)(3) no environmental review is required;
- Adopted Resolution No. 23-5652 approving payment of bills for Fiscal Year 2022-23 and found that adoption of the resolution authorizing the payment of bills is exempt from review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) per Section 15061(b)(3);
- Continued the public hearing for amendments to Series C Code Amendments of Title 9 (Zoning Regulations), Chapter 1 (Zoning Code) to the next City Council meeting on February 21, 2023 and found that this project is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15305 of the CEQA Guidelines pertaining to minor alterations to land use limitations and Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because the project is not a project as defined in Section 15378 and it can be seen with certainty to have no possibility of a significant effect on the environment;
- Continued the public hearing regarding expedited, non-discretionary multi-family review process and a library of prototype architectural designs for multi-family projects to a City Council meeting date uncertain and found that this project is exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15305 of the CEQA Guidelines pertaining to minor alterations to land use limitations and Section 15061(b)(3) of the CEQA Guidelines because the project is not a project as defined in Section 15378 and it can be seen with certainty to have no possibility of a significant effect on the environment;
- Awarded a Consultant Services Contract to SWA Landscape Architects for the playground renovations at Live Oak Park and Temple City Park and authorize the City Manager to enter into a Contract once reviewed and approved as to form by City Attorney, approved a budget amendment in the amount \$236,000 from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, Fund 14, and found that the Playground Renovation project is not subject to CEQA review pursuant to 15302(b), which exempts from CEQA review projects that replace an existing structure with a new structure that is substantially the same size, purpose and capacity. This agenda item meets the criteria for this exemption because the playground structure will replace the same existing feature at Live Oak Park and Temple City Park;
- Received updates from the City Attorney and City Manager;
- Approved the Minutes of the Regular Successor Agency to the Former Temple City Community Redevelopment Agency meeting of August 16, 2022;

- Adopted Resolution No. 23-5655-SA authorizing payment of bills for the Successor Agency to the Former Temple City Community Redevelopment Agency; and
- Received Councilmember reports on items separate from the meeting agenda.
